


to supply lower limb prostheses to 360 amputees in 16 states




DONATED PROSTHETICS PROGRAM 2021 (U.S.)

7,054 prosthetic parts were donated by 187 donors from 37 states (green)




5,938 parts were distributed for the benefit of 420 amputees in 28 states (red) and 16 countries (gold)





LIMBS FOR LIFE FOUNDATION Client Demographics 2021




Client Income/National Poverty Level

- → Average income of client served was 64% of the poverty level
- → Household income of 90% of clients served was below 138% of the Federal Poverty Level (eligibility level for Medicaid)
- → In 2021, Medicaid did not cover prosthetic care for those over 17 years of age in Oklahoma, Texas, Mississippi, Alabama or Georgia, home to 94% of Limbs for Life clients

In 2016, Limbs for Life was notified that it was named as a partial beneficiary of a generous Trust which continues distributions into 2022. LFL's beneficial interest in these assets was recognized as income of \$13,478,871 in 2017.

The Foundation has two goals regarding this tremendous gift:

- Use funds to satisfy the mission restoring lives by providing financial assistance to amputees that have no access to any other means to obtain a new prosthesis.
- Invest a substantial portion of these distributions in income producing assets, enabling the Foundation to provide services well into the future.
